Best for: Middle and high school students

Improv teaches you to think on your feet, be present, be creative and be a leader. For this activity, two players will do a scene. If they have trouble starting, the audience can suggest their relationship and where the scene is taking place.

As they interact, both players pretend to be forgetful and the audience fills in the word (the stranger the better). The players must justify the sentence and continue on until the teacher feels like the scene is complete. Keep rotating students until everyone in the class has had a chance to participate.

Example:

Player 1: “I want to buy one of those... um...”

Audience member: “Monster trucks”

Player 1: “I want to buy one of those monster trucks because I like to drive over buildings.”

Player 2: “Very interesting. I prefer driving over buildings with... um...”

Audience member: “Ice skates”
